

The Young Environmentalist Leadership Course (YELC)

The Central Caribbean Marine Institute's (CCMI) Young Environmentalist Leadership Course (YELC) provides an opportunity for up to 10 local students to continue their educational pathway in the marine sciences, environmental conservation, or ecotourism. From April - August, YELC participants complete their PADI Open Water, Advanced Open Water, and Rescue Diver certifications before attending a 7-day residential course at the Little Cayman Research Centre (LCRC) with CCMI's education team. Students are also trained in the Emergency First Responder course and the Emergency Oxygen provider course for scuba related injuries. Alongside these skills, participants are taught how to use various underwater tools and equipment to better assist them with research projects and citizen science initiatives across the Caribbean. Students take part in networking opportunities, lionfish dissections, CV and cover letter



workshops, Caribbean marine creature identification, interview skill building, a stakeholder workshop, and mock job interviews.



This programme works to build the skills of 10 young Caymanians or permanent residents of the Cayman Islands who seek the experience to become enthusiastic environmental ambassadors. Students are exposed to a breadth of opportunities in our local marine industry, and as a result, they make important connections for future employment and internship opportunities. Local businesses that have been supportive and involved in this programme over the years include Go Pro Diving Cayman, Dive Tech, Cayman Eco Divers Foundation, The Blue Iguana Recovery Programme, The National Trust of the Cayman Islands, Shark Conservation Cayman, Plastic Free Cayman, Red Sail Sports, Ocean Frontiers, Pro Yacht, the Mangrove Rangers, Cayman Kayaks, the Southern Cross Club, Little Cayman Beach Resort, Little Cayman Divers, Pirates Point Resort, and government agencies including the Cayman Islands Department of Environment, John Gray High School, Clifton Hunter High School, the University College of the Cayman Islands, and the Cayman Islands Further Education Centre.

The YELC programme bridges an important gap for local students who may not otherwise have access to post-secondary school education or industry certifications in the Cayman Islands, breaking down financial and educational barriers.

Applications are currently open for 10 fully funded scholarships thanks to the financial support provided by Foster's Supermarket, Rotary Central, and Go Pro Cayman Diving.

Applicant Requirements

- Caymanian nationals or permanent residents of the Cayman Islands
- In final year in the Cayman Islands school system or recent school graduate
- Interest in pursuing a career in marine science, environmental conservation, or ecotourism

The complete course costs, includes;

- 7 days of meals at the Little Cayman Research Centre
- Ground transportation in Little Cayman
- Roundtrip flights from Grand Cayman or Cayman Brac to Little Cayman

- PADI Advanced Open Water Diver certification course
- PADI Rescue Diver certification course
- PADI Emergency First Responder certification course
- PADI Emergency Oxygen Provider certification course
- All SCUBA dives & equipment during 7 days of stay at the Little Cayman Research Centre
- All instructor fees & classroom and field materials
- The use of CCMI bicycles and kayaks during 7 days of stay at the Little Cayman Research Centre
